In Language Arts this week, our focus was on summarizing information and identifying an author's point of view. After reading and discussing <u>The Polar Express</u>, written by Chris Van Allsburg, students worked with partners to summarize various passages from the book. Likewise, students worked together to identify and explain several examples of figurative language found in this popular holiday story. Additionally, after reading and discussing another heartwarming holiday story entitled, <u>The Trees of the Dancing Goats</u>, written by Patricia Palacco, students wrote a short narrative entitled, "If I Were a Gift."

In Math, we continued applying division strategies to solve problems throughout the week. We also moved on to identifying factors and multiples of a number, using a one-hundred chart, multiplication, and division. Students also worked on classifying numbers as either prime or composite based on the number of factors they have.

In Social Studies, students were given time to revise and edit their research paragraphs on GoogleDocs.

In Science, we wrapped up our Energy and Speed Unit this week. Next week, we will begin exploring Plant and Animal Parts.
